DIRECTIONS: Take I-90 East toward Cle Elem. Approximately 7 miles west of Cle Elem, take exit 78. At the top of the exit ramp, turn left and go back over the freeway. At the intersection, turn left (west) and drive to entrance of Ensign Ranch. Scouts will be dropped off at a designated location after you enter Ensign Ranch, follow the road and pass over the bridge. Watch for the signs and check the map. Scouts will follow the trail, stopping at the judging station, then onto the gathering place. Cars will proceed to the check in area for directions on where to park. After parking, Adult leaders will report to the Administration tent to check in and meet their SPL. No vehicles will be allowed in campsite.

EQUIPMENT

EACH SCOUT: 10 essentials & field uniform, extra shoes and socks, tent, sleeping bag, hiking pack, extra clothes, camp chair, or seat cushion, hiking boots, toiletries and personal gear, mess kit, sleeping pad, 1 stave per scout, scout handbook, rain gear. Pack for rain, snow, hot & cold weather.

EACH PATROL: cook kit, patrol first aid kit, patrol flag.

EACH TROOP: Troop flag, American Flag, troop first aid kit.

FOOD Scouts should bring a brown-bag dinner for Friday night. The patrols are responsible for preparing breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, and lunch and dinner on Saturday. (Alert! 50 Miler Recipe competition is lunch on Saturday.) Each patrol will invite an adult to join them. Scouts are to bring snacks for Saturday, and money for lunch on the way home on Sunday.

FEES \$20.00 CASH. Provide additional \$10.00 CASH to your patrol for food. Bring some extra spending money for lunch on Sunday on the way back.

Troop 166 encourages the participation of all our Scouts in as many activities as possible.
