

DESTINATION: Camp Casey, Whidbey Island

DEPART Meet at Wedgwood Presbyterian Church parking lot **at 8:00 AM Saturday, Jan. 30th**. Troop will depart at 8:30 sharp or as soon as the cars are full.

LEADERSHIP **ADULT:** Peter Krystad (206-412-0684) **SCOUT:** Senior Patrol Leader

PROGRAM Winter weekend overnight indoors in a heated bunkhouse. Scouts will stay at Camp Casey, adjacent to Fort Casey State Park. Sleeping is in bunks in open bunkrooms in a renovated Company Quarters building, which formerly served as housing for enlisted military personnel stationed at Fort Casey. Indoor bathrooms and hot showers are provided.

Activities will include excellent beach hiking, exploring the historic gun batteries at Fort Casey, and an outdoor campfire.

ROUTE I-5 North / State Route 525 to Mukilteo, ferry to Clinton, State Route 525 to Camp Casey.

EQUIPMENT Bring a sleeping bag and pillow, toiletries, flashlight/headlamp, and Scout handbook. Bring a towel if planning to take a shower. Bunks are equipped with foam pads. Bring boots and clothing suitable for being outdoors in cold, windy, and wet weather. Bring slippers or indoor shoes for the bunkhouse. Camping and cooking gear is not required.

FOOD **Bring a sack lunch for Saturday.** Dinner Saturday night and breakfast Sunday morning are included and served family-style in the camp mess hall. Scouts should bring another lunch or money for lunch on the way home.

FEE **\$20 CASH** covers transportation, lodging, and dinner on Saturday and breakfast on Sunday. **All adults must pay \$40.65 camp fee, plus ferry fare if not driving Scouts.** Scholarships are available. Contact Bill Montgomery at least 5 days prior to the outing.

RETURN Arrive back at church parking lot between 1 and 3pm. Will e-mail the troop group e-mail with an estimate.

SIGN-UP Signed permission slips and fees may be turned in at the troop meeting on Jan 11th or January 25th (no Troop meeting January 18th, MLK). However, **you must e-mail Peter Krystad (peter.krystad@gmail.com) no later than Thursday Jan. 21st to confirm your Scout is attending.** Final headcount for meal planning is due to Camp Casey that day.
